## **Unologic Trouble shooting Guide**

<u>Important Note</u>: For any unusual problem 'System reset' your radio (see page 21) of Instruction book). An electronic copy of the latest Troubleshooting Guide can be obtained by requesting at <u>a.g@robertsts.com</u> email address.

Please note: If you live in a basement flat, or your building is steel-framed or reinforced concrete, or if the topography of where you live means you get poor FM or mobile phone service, your DAB coverage may be affected.

Symptoms	Remedies
1. Radio cuts out. <a href="http://www.ukdigitalradio.co">http://www.ukdigitalradio.co</a> <a href="mailto:m/advice/toptips/">m/advice/toptips/</a>	<ul> <li>Make sure the aerial is fully extended. Reposition the radio/aerial to get maximum signal strength (ref. To page 9-Signal strength display).</li> <li>Make sure batteries are not flat Try radio on mains (using mains adaptor).</li> <li>Check the digital radio (DAB) coverage in your area using the link – www.ukdigitalradio.com/coverage/search/default.asp and your postcode.</li> <li>The type of building and surroundings can seriously affect the DAB reception. Sizeable concrete and metal work in the building (e.g. Block of flats, shopping centre, near or under a bridge, thermal insulation with aluminium foil) can considerably reduce the signal strength.</li> <li>If the coverage is weak in your area then try this link</li> </ul>

<ul><li>2. Rechargeable batteries are not charging.</li><li>Not working on batteries.</li></ul>	Check & do the following:  • Batteries are inserted with correct polarity (+, - sign).  • Battery(s) are not loose in the battery compartment –
Tion woming on outcome	both sides of the batteries must touch the metal plates.
	If loose pull the –ve spring plate out so the battery sits
	<ul> <li>tight.</li> <li>Set the switch (located in battery compartment) to 'Charge ON' position.</li> <li>Make sure battery terminals and the metal plates in the battery compartment are clean.</li> <li>Do not mix charged and discharged batteries.</li> <li>Do not mix different capacity batteries, all should have same mAh.</li> <li>Use only rechargeable batteries.</li> <li>Correct mains adaptor plugged in the wall socket and lead connected to the radio. Switch ON the mains. Ensure radio is switched off (not playing) and green light is flashing.</li> <li>Batteries are charging when green is flashing. Leave it connected until the green is steady.</li> <li>OR REPLACE THE BATTERIES.</li> </ul>

3. Display starts to fade, sound breaking up, signal strength shows low. Radio switches off.	• These are typical low battery symptoms (if using on batteries) try a set of new batteries. Make sure batteries are inserted correctly. Charge your batteries, if using rechargeable.
4. Rechargeable batteries do not last long after full charge.	<ul> <li>Rechargeable batteries must be charged before use.</li> <li>Make sure the batteries used are NiMH and not NiCad.</li> <li>When new, rechargeable batteries need few charge and discharge cycles before restoring to full capacity.</li> <li>To condition new batteries, disconnect the power lead when red light go out and reconnect the power after 10 minutes. Repeat this procedure 4-5 times.</li> <li>Play time period depends on the capacity of the batteries. Typical 1300mAh battery should last for 6 hours when fully charged. Higher capacity batteries will last longer.</li> <li>Batteries used under proper conditions can last 500 cycles or more see manufacturer data sheet.</li> </ul>
5. Cannot receive BBC Sports Extra, display shows "Not Available".	This radio station is not transmitting all the time. 6. Non-rechargeable batteries not lasting long.	<ul> <li>Make sure the batteries are ALKALINE and not zinc-carbon or other type.</li> <li>Good make batteries should last approximately 20 hours when used 4 hours a day on DAB band. On FM band life is shorter. See page 26 'Battery Life'.</li> </ul>
7. Radio plays only one station. Unable to change station. None of the buttons work on DAB (follow the second remedy).	<ul> <li>Make sure you are pressing "Tuning" knob (momentarily) after tuning the tuning knob. See page 8.</li> <li>Or Switch the radio to FM immediately after pressing on/off button then system reset the radio as described on page 21.</li> </ul>
8. On/Off switch has to be pressed several times.  9. When tuning control is turned only one or very few stations are showing on the bottom line.	<ul> <li>Make sure the batteries are not flat, recharge or replace the batteries.</li> <li>When first connected, leave it connected for few seconds before switching it on.</li> <li>Press and release the button. Do not hold.</li> <li>Wait for few seconds.</li> <li>If radio switches off, recharge or replace the batteries.</li> <li>Make sure ♥ symbol is not showing at top right corner. If showing then press and release 'Preset' button. See page 17.</li> <li>Or see symptom 7.</li> </ul>
